Navy League Cadet Corps (ages 11-13)

The training program is less arduous than our senior cadet program, but still challenges and engages its members with a wide variety of training opportunities designed to give cadets exposure to Navy life.

Naval Sea Cadet Corps (ages 13-17)

The senior cadet program exposes its members to the full rigors of a military training program. Cadets are required to attend a mandatory two-week recruit training camp. After this requirement is met, cadets have the opportunity to participate in a variety of exciting training evolutions.

Every year our cadets participate in training opportunities such as SCUBA, field and medical training, photojournalism, police science and sailing. Cadets even have the opportunity to travel abroad and meet Sea Cadets from around the world through our International Exchange Program.
